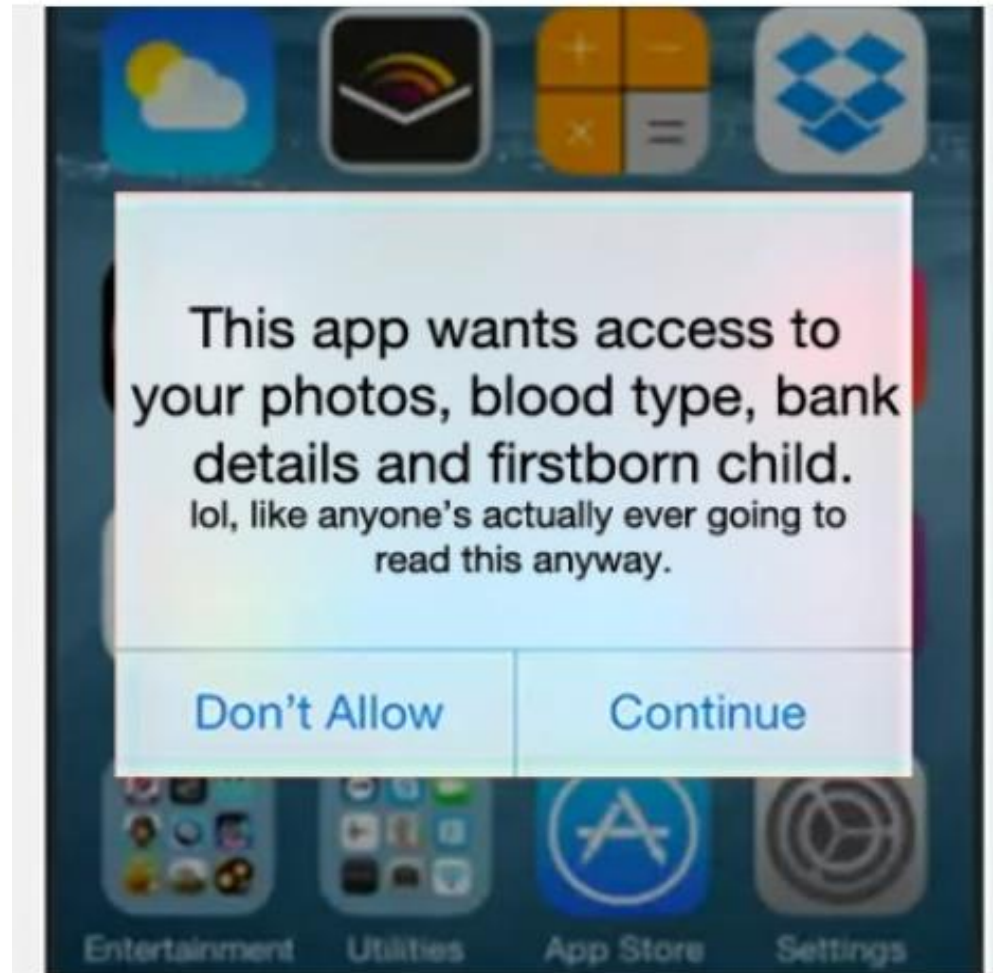
- <http://www.bbc.co.uk/newsround/13908828> is a hard-hitting but truthful documentary that gets the point across effectively to children.

- * www.miniclip.com and friv are the favourite 'online gaming' website of choice by our children.
- * It is safe if children are being observed/ monitored.
